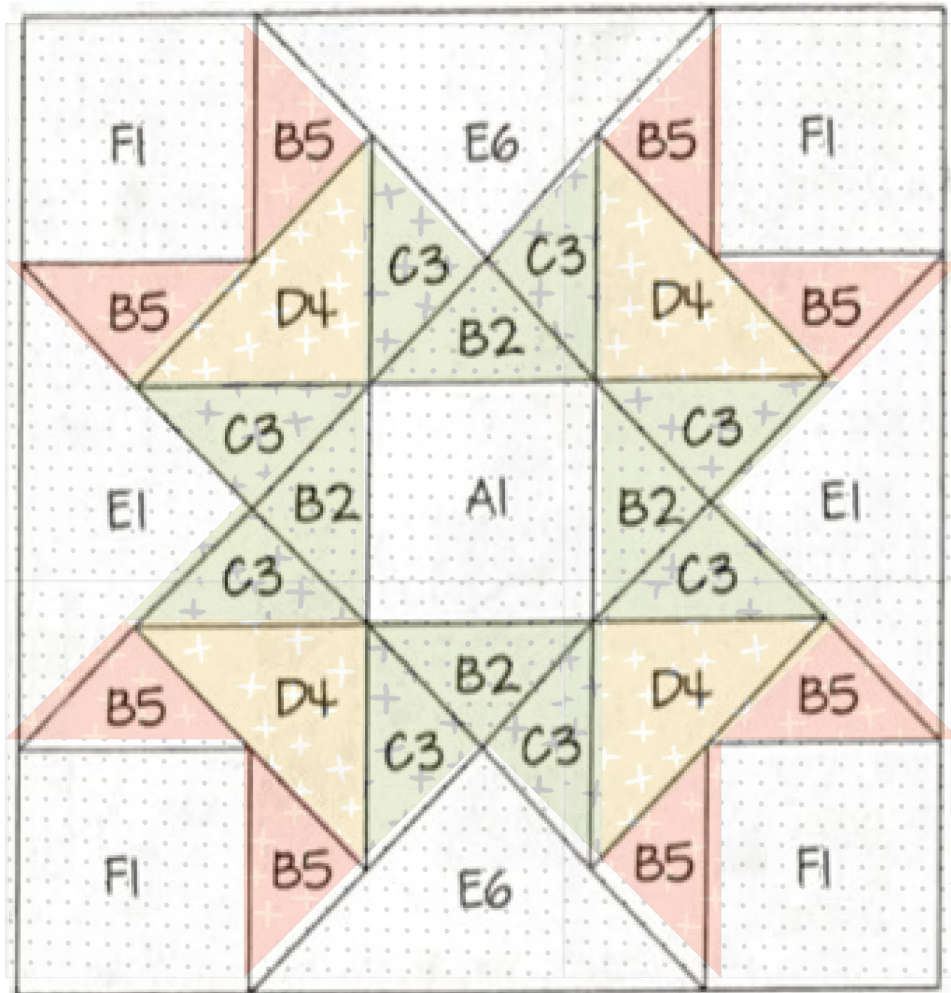


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Essential Star

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Background Fabric #1: A1 (1) 3 ½" square

Green Fabric #2: B2 (2) 3" squares - Cut each in half once diagonally to make 4 triangles

Green Fabric #3: C3 (4) 3" squares

Mustard Fabric #4: D4 (1) 5 ½" square

Orange Fabric #5: B5 (4) 3" squares - Cut in half once diagonally to make 8 triangles

Background Fabric #6: E6 (1) 7 ¼" square - Cut in half twice diagonally to make 4 triangles

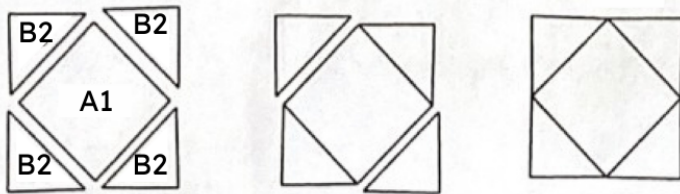
F6 (4) 3 ½" squares

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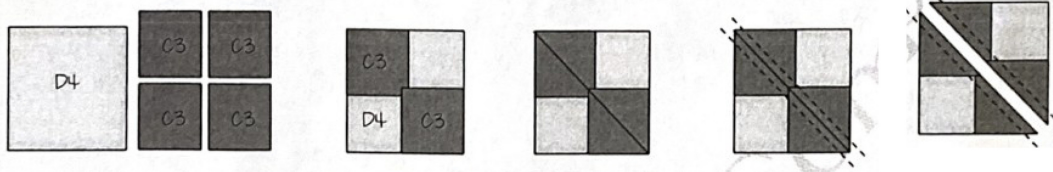
Step 1 - Centre Block Construction

To make the center square unit, sew four B2 triangles to the A1 square

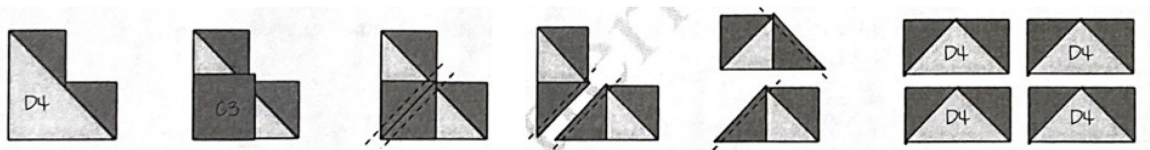


Step 2 - No Waste Flying Geese

To make the first set of flying geese select 4 - C3 squares and a D4 square. With the right sided together, lay 2 - C3 squares on the D4 square in opposite corners. With a rule and a pencil, draw a line diagonally from the top left corner to the bottom right corner. Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the pencil line. Cut along the pencil line

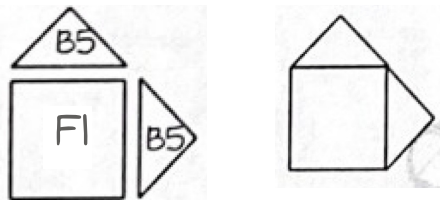


Press the seams toward the small triangles. With the wrong sided together, lay a C3 square on the D4 triangle. Draw a diagonal line from the bottom left corner to the top right corner of the C4 squares. Sew a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both sides of the pencil lines. Cut along the pencil lines. Repeat with the other unit to make a total of four flying geese units.



Step 3 - Corner Unit

To make a corner unit, sew 2 - B5 triangles to a F1 square. Make four corner units.

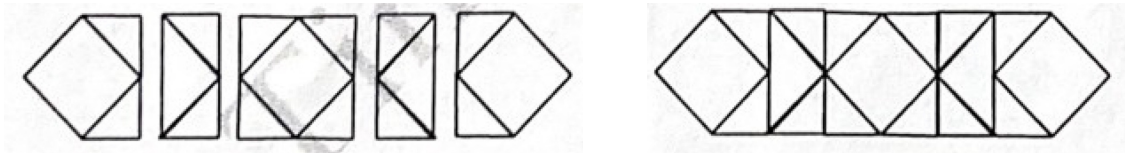


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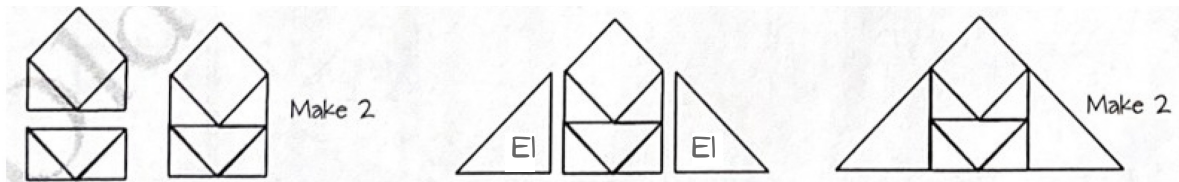
Step 4 - Middle Row

To make the middle row, sew the corner units, two flying geese and the center square together.



Step 5 Extended Corner Units

Sew the two remaining corner units to the two remaining flying geese. Then sew EI triangles to the sides.



Step 6 Assembly

To assemble the block, sew the three units together as shown.
